Vasanta College for Women is one of the oldest college of Varanasi (estd. 1913), admitted to the privileges of Banaras Hindu University and runs under the aegis of Krishnamurti Foundation India, a world renowned foundation devoted to the cause of education. Library

The college Library is fully computerized with barcode facility. Issue and return of books are done with barcode scanner. The library has an Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC) facility for the students and teachers. The database can be accessed at our OPAC. The Library has digitized old BHU Question papers and created database for B.A., B.Com, B.Ed., and M.A. students. The teachers have donated their publication for Institutional repository for our library. The Knowledge Center is equipped with 41 computers and two WIMAX connections with 2 mbps speed for INTERNET service for the students. Three printers are available for the readers. The Teacher's & Research Scholar's Room is also equipped with 7 computers with Internet facility. The Center provides the Infrastructure facility for computer and Internet services for students and teachers. The total collection of the library till 31st March 2018 is 43,656. The library has created Periodical Section and subscribed 42 Journals, 12 magazines and 10 newspapers. The text book and reference book sections are providing text book and reference book to the users for their academic work. Library Photocopy section is also providing its service to the users. The library subscribed NLIST service of INFLIBNET which offers online access to 6,000+ ejournals and 31,35,000+ ebooks. The library also registered college in National Digital Library of India which provides a single window search facilities to act as a one-stop shop for all digital resources.

The college library organized User Education Programme in the month of August 2017 for BA I, B.Com I, B.Ed I, M.Ed I Year, and MA I Year students. The library also organized Information Literacy Programme for the students of Post Graduates, Education and research scholars about the access of Internet, open access journals and research methodology in
