J Krishnamurti Study Centre

J. Krishnamurti Study Centre is the first centre in India on J. Krishnamurti sponsored by UGC, New Delhi. The purpose of the centre is to promote the teachings of J. Krishnamurti. In the session the centre organized two talks on 'Stress & Anxiety' and 'Why is it so difficult to say: I Don't Know' by French Linguist and Krishnamurti Scholar Jackie McInley. Two certificate courses were started with around 20 - 25 students from July 2018 and January 2019. In addition to this weekly interactive sessions with PG and B.Ed Students were organized regularly.

Medha: The College has signed an MoU with Medha in 2017. Since then, it is working on campus to make the students more employable by imparting training through its program, Career Advancement Bootcamp (CAB) along with offering internships and full-time job opportunities to the interested candidates. In this session 37 students were registered and 22 have completed their 30 hours program and were certified. Medha organized internal and external industry talks and visits with experts. This year, the students met Mr. Ashwini Kumar Singh, Founder of Tabula Groups Pvt. Ltd. and Student Aggregator and learnt about how the industry works, and future job opportunities for the students. Medha linked 4 students to internships with organizations like Pantaloons, Karvy Stock Broking Ltd., Aditya Birla Capital etc. Medha continues to find new employer partners with whom students can work. One of them Ms. Akanksha's Sahay has completed internships in HDFC Bank and Karvy Stock Broking Ltd.

Medha, (a Lucknow based NGO) provide skills training, career counseling and workplace exposure, ongoing job placement and alumni support to students at their existing educational institution. Since 2011, it has worked with over 13,000 students across 65 educational institutions, placed them into internships and full-time jobs with 500 leading employers, and built public-private partnerships with various departments within the Governments of Uttar Pradesh, Haryana, Bihar, and Meghalaya. Medha is supported by leading global foundations and corporations like the Michael & Susan Dell Foundation, Citigroup, and Accenture,

LEaders Accelerating Development (LEAD) : The LEaders Accelerating Development (LEAD) Program of Deshpande Foundation, Hubballi, Karnataka fosters innovative and entrepreneurial thinking within the students by exposing them to social issues and encouraging them to volunteer their time and effort into the community. LEAD ignites their talent to come up with creative solutions. Through this platform the students implement bold solutions to small and big problems in their communities and simultaneously build their self-confidence and leadership skills.

The College Library is fully computerized with barcode facility. Issue and return of books are done with barcode scanner. The library has OPAC facility for the students and teachers. The database can be accessed at our OPAC. The Library has digitized old BHU Question papers and created database for BA, B.Com, B.Ed., MA, Travel & Tourism Management and Mass Communication students. The teachers have donated their publication for Institutional repository for our library. The Knowledge Center is equipped with 41 computers with INTERNET facility for the students. Three printers are available for the readers. The Teacher's & Research Scholar's Room is also equipped with 7 computers with Internet facility. The total collection of books in the library till 31st March 2019 is 44,362. The library has created Periodical Section and subscribed 42 Journals, 11 magazines and 11 newspapers. The text book and reference book sections are providing the books to the users for their academic work. Photocopy section is also there in the Library. The library subscribed NLIST service of INFLIBNET which offers online access to 6,000+ ejournals and 31,35,000+ ebooks. The college is also registered in National Digital Library of India which provides a single window search facilities to act as a one-stop shop for all digital resources.

The library organized User Education Programme and Computer Literacy Programme in the month of August and September 2018 for BA- I Year, B.Com- I Year, B.Ed- I Year, M.Ed- I Year, and MA- I Year students respectively.
