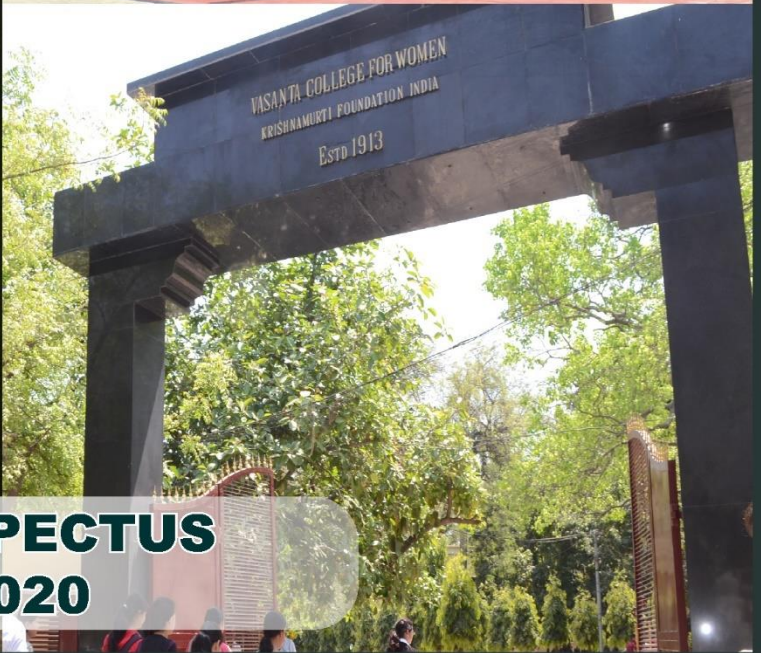
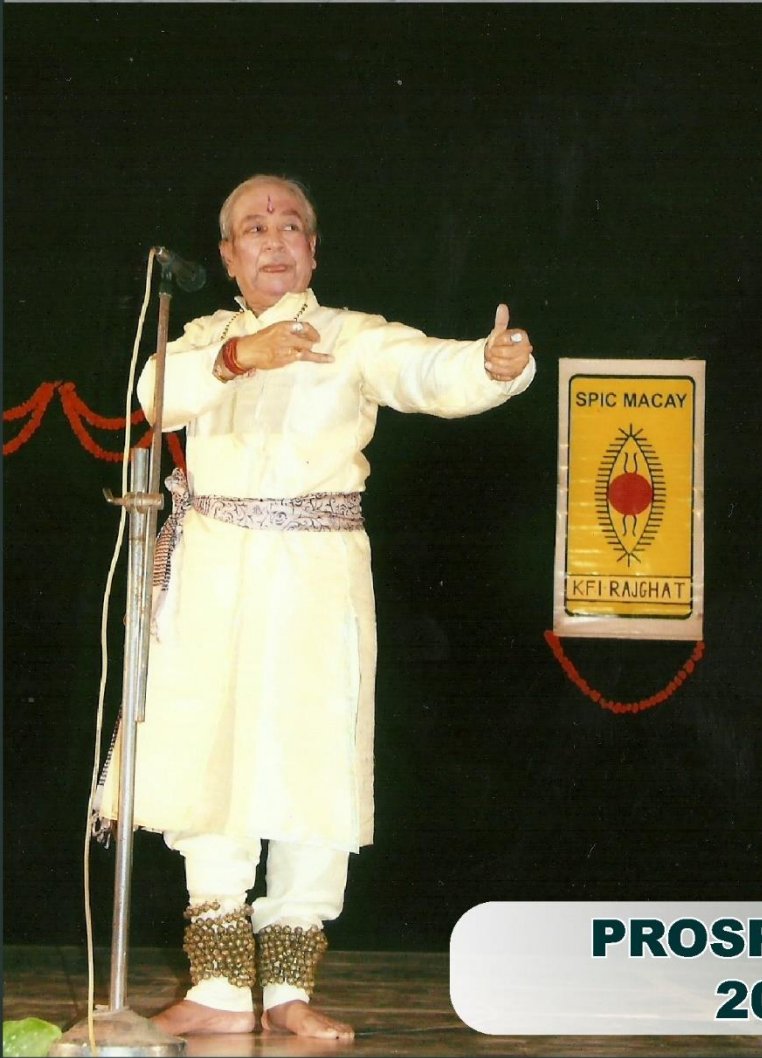
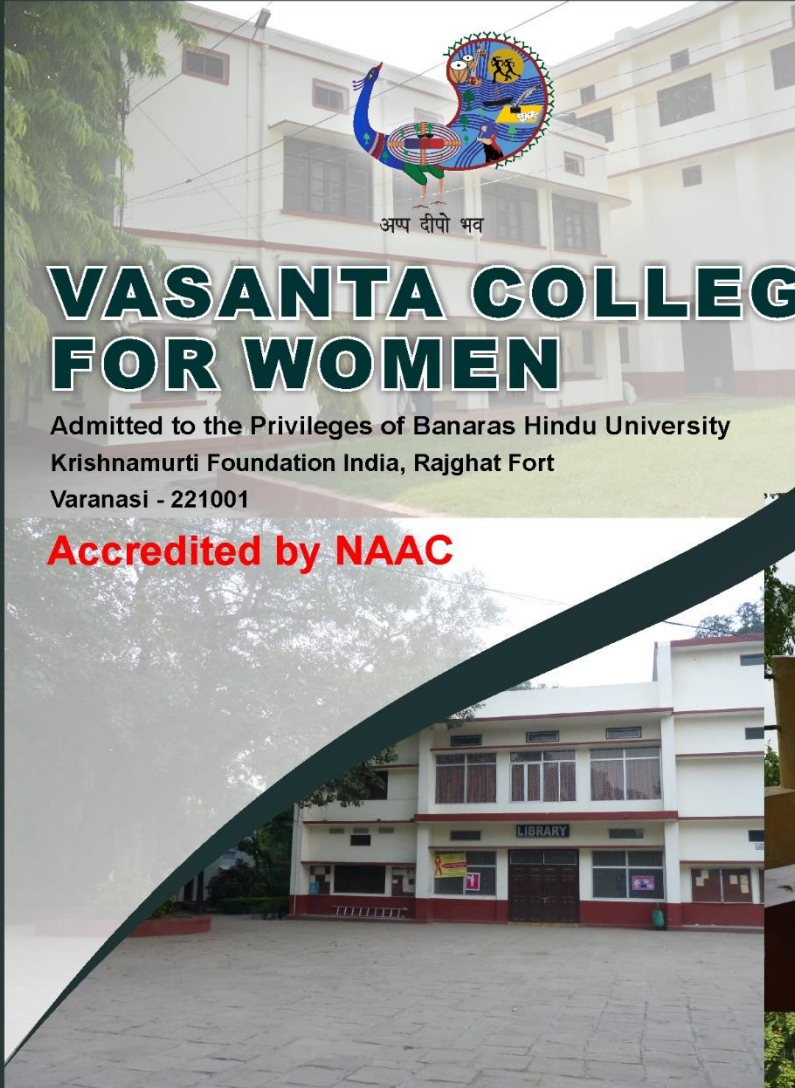

ABOUT COLLEGE

Vasanta College for Women is one of the oldest colleges of Varanasi (estd. 1913), admitted to the privileges of Banaras Hindu University and runs under the aegis of Krishnamurti Foundation India, a world renowned foundation devoted to the cause of education. 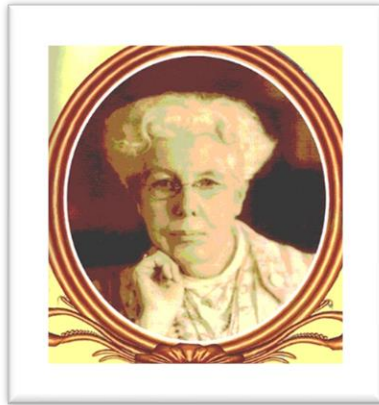
These words of our founder Dr. Annie Besant reflect the commitment of this Institution towards women education as the cornerstone for making a strong and vibrant India.

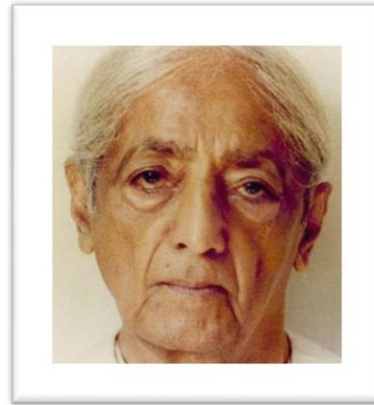
Vision:

HISTORY (OUR FOUNDERS)

Vasanta College for Women was established on 07 July 1913, by Dr. Annie Besant, leading figure of the Indian national movement including Pupul Jayakar, Achyut Patvardhan, S.L. Dhar, etc. The College celebrated its centenary year in the session 2013-2014. Prof. Hari Gautam, Ex-Chairperson, UGC was the Chief Guest on the occasion.

The College started as the *Theosophical Collegiate School for Boys* and *Theosophical Collegiate School for Girls* in the Theosophical Society campus, Varanasi. The names of both schools were changed in 1917 as **Theosophical National School for Boys and Girls, Banaras** on the starting of the Society for Promotion of National Education (SPNE). It was affiliated to National University, Adyar, Chennai. The Girls School became a High School in 1920 and intermediate college in 1922 and was known as **Theosophical National Girls School and Women's College, Benares**.

Since 1923, the schools and colleges sent pupils to the Allahabad University and later from 1948 to Banaras Hindu University. When Rishi Valley Trust was founded in 1928, these institutions were transferred to it. The Girls College in 1940s came to be known as the **Vasanta College for Women** as a mark of gratitude to Dr. Annie Besant, the founder of the College. The present name of the college was given in 1940 or 1941. The college was running B.A. courses and the first batch of eight girls appeared in B.A. examination as regular students for the first time in 1948.

The College was shifted to the present campus of Rajghat on the banks of river Ganga in the year 1954 but the building the land was purchased in 1928. The college and its sister organizations, geographical location at the confluence of river Ganga and Varuna has a unique historical significance. Rajghat happens to be the oldest inhabited place of Varanasi dating since 8th century B.C. The nearby historical sites are the ASI excavated site of Rajghat, Lal Khan's Tomb (Medieval Period), Adikeshav temple (one of the site of 1857 revolt) and Ghat, Chandan Shaheed Mausoleum. The area of Rajghat has an intellectual heritage of its own. Lord Buddha passed through Rajghat crossing river Varuna to reach Sarnath and deliver his first sermon. Secondly, this place was blessed by the philosophical dialogue of Sri J. Krishnamurti, the Socrates of modern times.

The building of the College and its sister organizations have architectural features of the British period. The office, study centre and the Sangam House (Principal's residence) were occupied by the British engineers, who constructed the railway bridge (Dufferin Bridge) over Ganga in the year 1897. These buildings along with the land were acquired in 1928.

CAMPUS

Spread over an area of 300 acres in Rajghat, Varanasi, the college has a picturesque campus on the banks of river Ganga, and natural environment. The college has a good infrastructure and learning resources keeping in consonance its reputation as a famous Women's College of Varanasi. The college has 48 classrooms, 07 Labs, 02 Hostels; a well-equipped Library having its own ICT enabled Knowledge Centre, a separate Computer Lab for Education Department, Playground, Gym, Auditorium, Open Air Theatre, Canteen, Fruit corner, Stationary, Museum etc to facilitate proper learning & co-curricular activities of students leading to a holistic development of students. An internet facility with Wi-Fi connectivity has enhanced the e-learning capacity of students. The college has its transport facility having twelve buses for students and two cars.

In the KFI campus, the college has number of sister organization like School (10+2), Rural Centre, Sanjeevani Hospital, KFI Study Centre, Guest House, Dairy farm, Sewing Centre etc. On the campus we have a Health Centre with two resident doctors and two nurses having twenty-four beds with ambulance facility for emergency. The campus has a separate Engineering Department maintained by Krishnamurti Foundation India. The department takes care of the Civil/Electrical and other day to day repairing and maintenance.

DIPLOMA COURSES

(A) Certificate, Diploma and Advance Diploma Course in

(1) Travel and Tourism Management

(2) Mass Communication

The college is running Certificate, Diploma and Advance Diploma Course in (a) **Travel and Tourism Management** and (b) **Mass Communication** under UGC's Career Oriented Courses duly approved by Academic Council, Banaras Hindu University. This is a Skill Oriented, Add-on-course to be opted by students while pursuing their degree i.e. B.A./B.Com/B.Sc./MA. These courses are also open for regular students from any other college / university recognized by UGC. Admission to the following courses will be on the basis of marks obtained in 10+2 and/or entrance examination conducted by the college.

(B) Two Year (Part Time) UG Diploma in French

The college is running UG Diploma in French duly approved by Banaras Hindu University. This course is open for regular students of Vasanta College only. This course is to be opted by the students while pursuing their degree in the college i.e. B.A./B.Com/B.Ed./M.Ed. The students of final year are not eligible for admission. Admission to this course will be on the merit basis and/or entrance examination conducted by the college.

(C) Diploma/Certificate Courses under BHU Special Course of Studies

The college offers following Diploma/Certificate courses under Self Financing Courses of Banaras Hindu University. The students may apply online through BHU Admission Portal i.e. www.bhuonline.in under Special Course of Studies of Banaras Hindu University.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Vasanta College for Women is an affiliated college of **Banaras Hindu University** (www.bhu.ac.in). The admissions in UG, PG and Ph.D. courses are done only through the (UET, PET, RET) Entrance Examination conducted by Banaras Hindu University. The students may apply for admission through **BHU Admission Portal** (www.bhuonline.in). The admissions are made strictly on the basis of merit index, availability of seats in the course, as per rules given in the BHU Information Bulletin and rules framed by the Banaras Hindu University from time to time.

After counseling, if a candidate gets admission in the college, she has to fill the **Admission Form** of the College (Google and PDF Form both), which may be downloaded from the college website (www.vasantakfi.ac.in). It is mandatory for students to fill the above form within seven days of the commencement of classes. The admission will be confirmed only after submitting the application form along with the academic, transfer certificates and the admission fee etc.

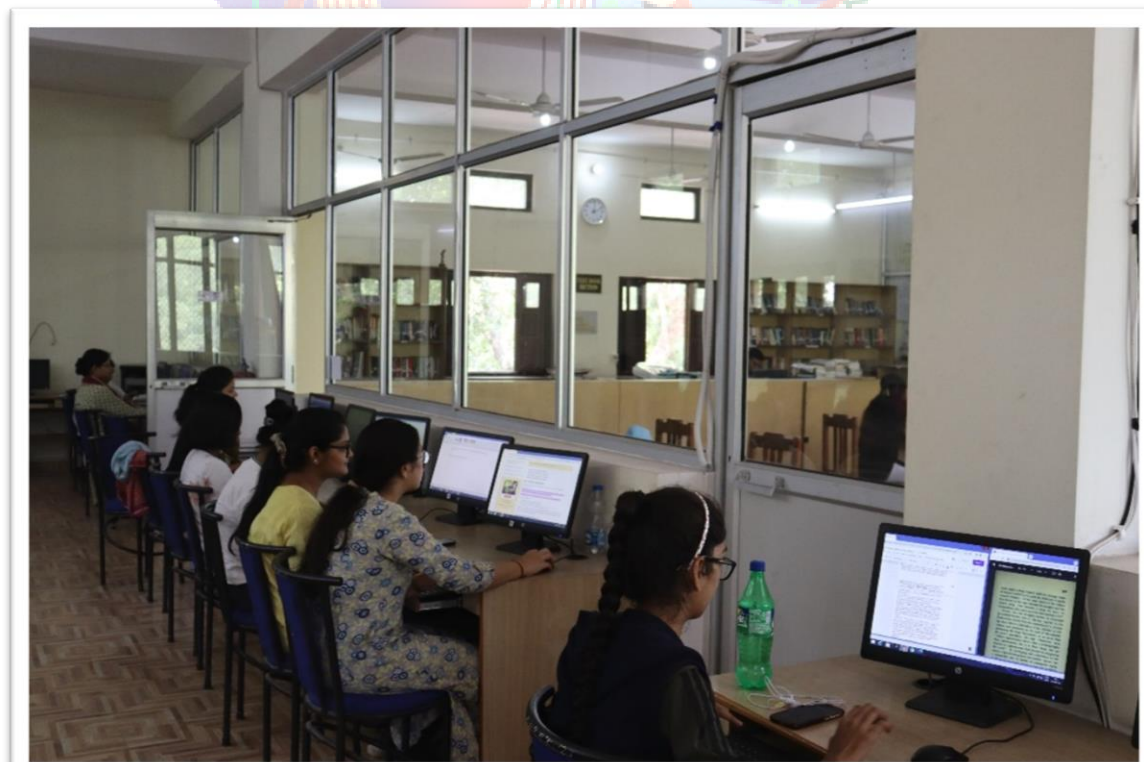
LIBRARY

The college has a well-equipped and spacious library in the campus. The ground floor has reading area, stack room and a computer lab for the teachers. The second floor comprises Reference and Periodical section, Knowledge Centre having more than forty computers with internet facility and three printers. The Library has an extensive collection of approximately **46,705** books on Arts, Social Sciences, Education and Commerce and leading Newspapers in English and Hindi, Periodicals (National and from abroad), collection of Encyclopaedias etc. The library is open for all the staff and students on all working days. They may avail its facilities according to the prescribed rules.

The Computer Lab known as Knowledge Centre is well equipped with updated computers with internet facilities and printers for the students. It is established in the library of the college.



LANGUAGE LAB

The Language Laboratory plays a crucial role in enhancing the communication skills of the students. The college has a well-equipped Language Laboratory with up-to-date software and gadgets.

In the campus, there are sitting arrangements under the trees near the bank of river Ganga. Very often during pleasant weather, the teachers take the classes there.



MUSEUM



Vasanta College for Women has not only been promoting women's education but is also committed to the preservation of the antiquities obtained from the ancient historical mounds of Kashi. The museum has a wonderful confluence of ancient stone artifacts of Kashi, which appear as the oldest symbol of religious harmony of Kashi. Preserved artifacts are believed from the Gupta period (5th century AD) to the 18th century AD. The important sculptures are Standing Buddha of Sarnath School of Arts, Kubera, Shiva, Varaha, Vishnu, Shakti and other deities etc.



HOSTEL

There are two hostels for students, known as Vasantashram - I and Vasantashram - II with accommodation capacity of 150 and 70 girls respectively. Vasantashram hostel runs under the aegis of Rajghat Education Centre, Krishnamaurti Foundation India, Varanasi. After the admission, the students are allotted hostel on the basis of merit, distance and need. After confirmation of admission, the students, who are desirous for hostel, are requested to send an e-mail to vasantacollegehostel@vasantakfi.ac.in The seats in hostel are limited and allotted on first come, first serve basis.

Facilities

- **Health and Medical Care:** The campus has a resident doctor and the dispensary has all basic facility to treat students (OPD). In case of serious illness, college consult city doctors and hospitals. The college has a number of MoUs with leading hospitals of Varanasi.
- **Games and Physical Education:** Games and exercises are the part of the every day schedule. The students may enjoy games like Basket ball, Badminton, Gym and Yoga etc. and the coaches are there to train them.
- **Music, Dance and Fine Arts:** The campus is always busy with one or the other cultural programs. There are many opportunity for girls to learn Music, Dance and Fine Arts depending on their talent and enthusiasm.
- **Cooking, Personality Development and Beautician Course:** The training and skill development programs are also organized for students like Cooking Classes, Yoga, Beautician, Personality Development, Diploma in French etc. Girls actively participate in all academic and co-curricular activities organized in the hostels. These activities include the Fresher, Induction Program, Janmashtami Celebration, Saraswati Puja, Farewell etc.

Transport : There are twelve (12) buses, provides transport facility to students to reach the campus conveniently throughout Varanasi.

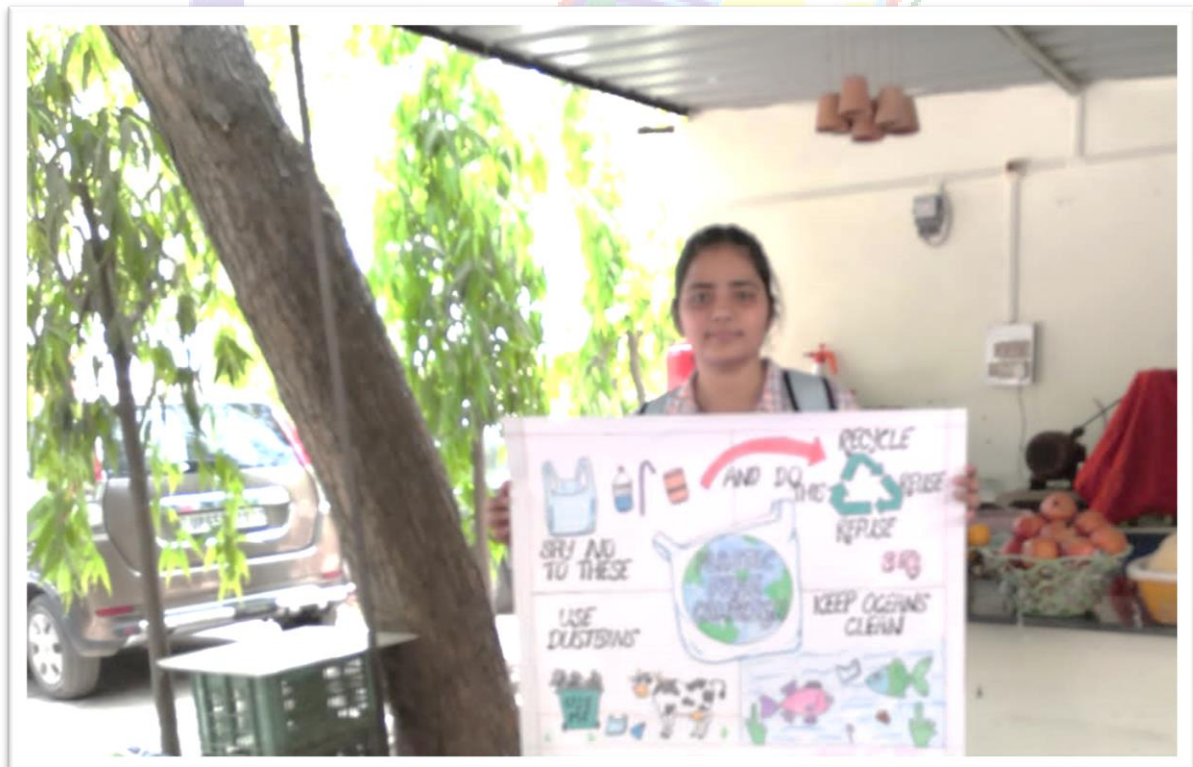

GYMNASIUM

The importance of exercise cannot be neglected for good physical and mental health. The institute offers Gymnasium facility to all its students and staff. The gym in the college has all the modern equipment for workout and is made available to students during morning and evening hours



HEALTH CENTRE

The college has a Health Centre in KFI Campus working 24X7 hours with two resident doctors and two nurses having 24 beds with ambulance facility. It attends students' medical need in case of emergency.



SPORTS

Sport plays a pivotal role in shaping student's personality and maintaining good health. There are many sport facilities in the college to keep our students physically fit i.e. Basketball, Volleyball, Table Tennis and Badminton etc. The campus has a different ground for these sports with lush green grass. J Krishnamurti Study Centre is the first centre in India on J Krishnamurti sponsored by UGC, New Delhi. The purpose of the centre is to promote the teachings of J Krishnamurti. The centre regularly conducts lectures and runs two certificate courses on the subject.



STUDENT'S CELL AND CLUBS

❖ Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

As per the guidelines of UGC, The primary objective of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution. It aims to promote measures for institutional functioning towards quality enhancement through internalization of quality culture and institutionalization of best practices. ❖ Co-Curricular Committee

To bring social skills, intellectual skills, moral values, personality development and character appeal among the students, Vasanta College for Women, Rajghat has constituted a specialized Co-curricular Activities Cell.
